Ron Alexander, R. Alexander Associates Inc.

Ron has promoted the cause of composting around the globe with his unique energy and forcefulness.



Ron Alexander entered the composting industry in 1984 after being interviewed by the first compost brokerage company in the U.S. He was one of the first full-time compost salespeople. "I was lucky enough to meet and interact with several of the researchers with roots at Beltsville (Rufus Chaney, Pat Millner, Larry Sikora, George Willson), and even worked for Dr. Eliot Epstein," notes Alexander. "Operating in the Mid-Atlantic, I also had the honor of working closely with Drs. William Mitchell and Frank Gouin."

From BioCycle's vantage point, Ron Alexander has blazed a path for compost and compost-amended products within the American Association of Plant Food Control Officials (AAPFCO) — state Department of Agriculture officials who register and regulate the distribution of fertilizer, soil amendments and liming agents. BioCycle readers and others in the composting industry have learned via Alexander's articles what can be said legally about "compost" on a product label and/or promotional materials. Similarly, he has worked tirelessly with state Departments of Transportation, landscape architects and others to establish specifications for compost use in storm water management and erosion and sediment control.
